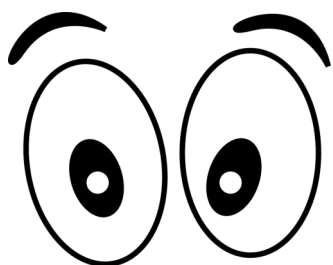

# Judging Team Heads to State!



Seven 4-H members from Kingman County participated in the 2018 K-State Livestock Sweepstakes Livestock Judging Contest in Manhattan on August 18th. Sweepstakes consist of four separate contest throughout the two-day contest including Livestock Judging, Meats Judging, Skillathon and Quiz Bowl. In preparation for the state livestock judging contest, Kingman 4-H team members, along with 50+ others from the state of Kansas competed in the local Kingman County Livestock Judging Classic just a week ago. Representing Kingman County 4-H were senior members, Brendan McBeth, Riley Krehbiel, Kael McBeth and Bailey Osborn. Judging as individuals were Greta Rosenhagen, Eliza Rosenhagen, and Brynlee Tetrick. There were 78 teams (4 members) total competing in the contest Saturday morning; Kingman finished 12th overall. Individually, our kids had a great day with a lot of learning opportunities as we move into the 2018-2019 judging year. Out of a total of 198 individuals our team members fought for the following places: Bailey Osborn, 24th; Riley Krehbiel, 46th; Brendan McBeth, 94th; Kael McBeth, 136th; Eliza Rosenhagen, 153rd; Greta Rosenhagen, 156th; Brynlee Tetrick, 167th. ### Record Book/KAP'S ?

#### Why turn in a Record Book/KAP?

The Record Book is an organized summary of your entire 4-H experience that contains a comprehensive report of your goals, plans and accomplishments. It is one way to make a formal review of your goals and achievements and is a helpful tool to plan your own growth for the future. Your records and report will be a good keepsake for years after you've finished your 4-H career. The record you build opens doors to many awards and benefits such as medals, trips, scholarships and other kinds of recognitions. Completing a record book will make it easier to apply for scholarships and state level awards.

#### 4-H Members develop the following life skills through record keeping:

- *Maintaining records of 4-H project and club work, school and community activities*
- *Keeping personal and business records Improving communication with other people*
- *Learning time management and organizational skills Learning responsibility and developing goal setting skills*

#### Do I have to do a Record Book/KAP for EVERY project I'm enrolled in?

The answer to that question is NO! Only fill out a record for the projects you would like to be considered for an award in. For example, Suzy is enrolled in Beef, Foods and Visual Arts. She only actively participated in the Beef and Visual Arts Projects during the year. She did take one entry of cookies to the fair. Because she was highly active in Beef and Visual Arts, those would be the Projects she would consider doing a KAP for.

#### What kind of awards can I apply for?

Each of the 30 project areas will award a certain number (a percentage of the total number of 4-H'ers enrolled in the project) of 'project pins' to the award winners (only projects checked on the nomination form will be considered for project winners.)

### Club Officer Notebooks

Reporters, Secretaries, Treasurers...did you know you can turn your notebooks in for county judging? Please turn them in by the date specified by your club leader.

### Key Award

The Key Award is given to youth 16 years or older, who have completed 4 years of 4-H membership, and who have been enrolled in the leadership project for more than 4 years. Youth must meet an additional 9 out of 11 requirements. It is a very prestigious award, and we encourage all who are eligible to apply!

### Achievement Pin Applications

These applications are also due with your Record Book. "Pin Apps" are an easy one or two page application for a 4-H'er to fill out each year as a member. They then receive the appropriate level pin at Achievement Celebration.

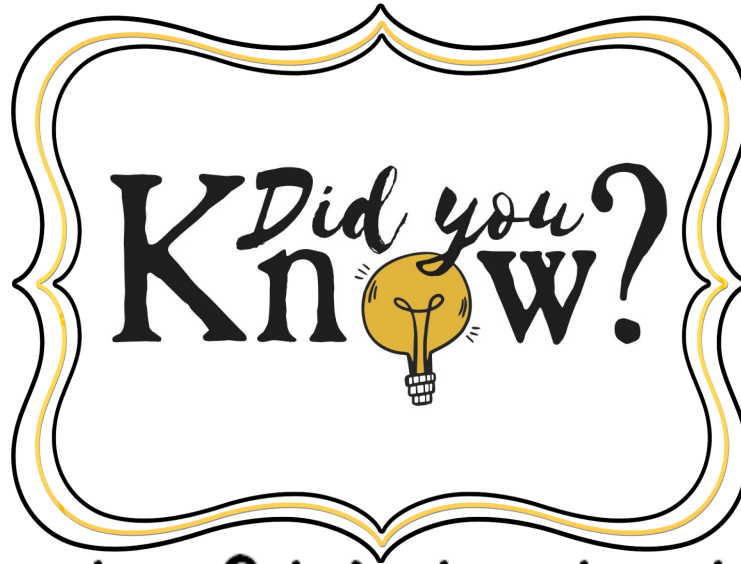
