

# PREPARE for the FAIR



To be eligible to sell an item, livestock or foods at the Kingman County Fair Premium Auction or Purple Ribbon Food Auction, members must complete a minimum of two items from the County, Regional or State Level **AND** attend at least three club meetings from August 2018-July 2019.

## 4-H LIVESTOCK TAGGING

If you were not present during the Market Beef weigh-in on March 9th, or you do not plan on attending small animal (Sheep, Goats, Hogs, Bucket Calves) weigh in on April 27th, you must call and make an appointment with Ag Agent Kallie Turner, to **tag your animals before May 1st**. There are no open class divisions for livestock at the county fair, so animals not tagged by May 1 will not be eligible to show during the Kingman County & 4-H Fair this coming summer. ## HORSE PROJECT MEMBERS

Horse deadlines are quickly approaching, are you prepared? All Horse ID and Coggins Health Papers must be up to date and turned into the Extension Office by May 1st. Horses must have ID papers signed and Coggins papers on file before they are eligible to be exhibited during 4-H events.

District Horse show entries are due June 10th. The Show is on Thursday June 27th in Hutch.

### Dress Code

Important

If you are planning on showing or selling any livestock during the fair it is important to remember the Show and Sale Dress Code:

Youth should wear a long or short sleeved collared shirt/blouse tucked into good, clean jeans or khaki pants, and sturdy, closed-toe shoes (boots are highly recommended). Youth should not wear t-shirts; tank tops; low-cut shirts; sheer blouses; sleeveless shirts; or ball caps.
